Flu vaccine available at all OCCHD clinic locations beginning Oct. 5 By appointment only

(Oklahoma City, OK) OCCHD will provide flu vaccines to the public at no out-of-pocket cost at clinic locations across Oklahoma County beginning Monday, Oct. 5.

Flu vaccination is recommended each year for everyone six months of age and older. It is especially important for adults 65 years and older, those with chronic diseases or immunocompromised, children less than five years of age or children with neurological disease, pregnant women and healthcare workers.

"If you've never had a flu shot before, this would be the year you want to get one," said Lynnda Parker, operations manager of the Clinical Services Division at OCCHD. "We're entering the flu season while COVID-19 is still circulating in our community, and receiving a flu vaccine is the first and most important step in protecting your family and yourself against possible severe complications from the flu".

Beginning October 5, OCCHD will offer the flu vaccine to the public, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The vaccine is offered with no out of pocket costs, and to continue with COVID-19 precautions, flu vaccine is by appointment only.
