Documentary Highlighting Addiction Recovery Will Be Featured at Bricktown Theater

Oklahoma City, Okla. – The <u>Oklahoma City-County Wellness Now Coalition</u>, <u>INTEGRIS Mental Health</u>, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, The Addiction Recovery Center, The Green Shoe Foundation, Parents Helping Parents, and Oklahoma Citizen Advocates for Addiction Recovery and Transformation Association are sponsoring a free screening of the documentary "<u>The Anonymous People</u>". It will be shown Thursday, April 6, 7-9 p.m. at the Harkins Theater in Bricktown.
